Details of Service	
	The Paediatric ward in GUH is a busy 32 bedded in-patient ward caring for children up to 16 years of age providing both scheduled and unscheduled medical and surgical care at Galway University Hospital.
	The Unit consists of an inpatient area with an adjacent Paediatric Day Unit providing scheduled care, phlebotomy, urgent reviews, vaccinations and day admission cases, e.g., MRI under sedation, transfusions and infusions.
	There is an adjacent outpatient clinic consisting of 7 examination rooms providing General Paediatric Clinical and Specialised clinics supported by a specialist multidisciplinary team e.g., paediatric cardiology, neurology, neurodisability, dermatology, respiratory, ophthalmology, allergy, neonatal and a dedicated Cystic Fibrosis Day care unit.





The West and North West region provides acute and specialist hospital and community services to the West and North West of Ireland – counties Galway, Mayo, Roscommon, Sligo, Leitrim, Donegal and adjoining counties.

	Key responsibilities include:
	 Developing a SSSS for the department/service¹, as applicable, based on the identification of hazards and the assessment of risks, and reviewing/updating same on a regular basis (at least annually) and in the event of any significant change in the work activity or place of work.
	 Ensuring that Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) is integrated into day-to-day business, providing Systems Of Work (SOW) that are planned, organised, performed, maintained, and revised as appropriate, and ensuring that all safety related records are maintained and available for inspection.
	 Consulting and communicating with staff and safety representatives on OSH matters. Ensuring a training needs assessment (TNA) is undertaken for employees, facilitating their attendance at statutory OSH training, and ensuring records are maintained for each employee.
	 Ensuring that all incidents occurring within the relevant department/service are appropriately managed and investigated in accordance with HSE procedures². Seeking advice from health and safety professionals through the National Health and Safety Function Helpdesk as appropriate.
	 Reviewing the health and safety performance of the ward/department/service and staff through, respectively, local audit and performance achievement meetings for example.
